At the end of the school day, Mr Curry unveiled a memorial plaque for Mr McMullan, which is located on the Maths Yard near the entry to the Maths corridor. This was followed by a race for staff, friends, and family as well as former students and parents.

Year 10 students onsite had a week of experiences of the workplace. The fantastic 'Pledge Project', led once again by Mr T. Roberts enabled students to meet and work with staff from Carden Park and Barlows, Students further consolidated their skills as they completed the 'Sustainable Food' Challenge on Wednesday, with the support of Chantel Humphreys, the Sustainability Project Manager at Iceland.



Students then visited the University of Chester, to learn more about post-18 options and student life.



The opportunities offered on Thursday and Friday were varied. Off-site, the adventure seekers had the opportunity to take part in walking in Bickerton, mountain biking at Delamere Forest, water sports at Manley Mere or snow sports at the Chill Factore. Others opted to ride the rollercoasters at Alton Towers, indulged in the chocolatey experience of Cadbury's World, or visit the animals at Chester Zoo.

Students who chose to stay in school took part in the amazing carousel offered by our talented Heber staff. Activities included rocket launching, origami, outdoor cooking, murder mystery and trainer designing, to name only a few!


Heber Students Experience The World Of Work

During Activity Week, students in Years 10 and 12 participated in work experience with over 200 placements across the Northwest and beyond. A variety of professions were sampled including medicine, veterinary science, law, and electrical engineering just to name a few.

Year 12 student, Niamh Sambrook (12SBo) secured a placement with surveyor 'Rostons' and worked alongside chartered surveyors and agricultural valuers. Niamh is pictured being trained to take aerial shots of land that was being surveyed for a client.



Daresbury Laboratories - Year 8

On Tuesday, 11th July, we took 30 Year 8 students to Daresbury Laboratories to take part in their Open week. A week where the Sci-Tech Daresbury campus doors are thrown open to invite schools and colleges to step inside a national laboratory which has recently celebrated 60 years of world-class innovation.



The research facility was packed full of incredible science experiments that investigate physics, biomedicine, chemistry, materials, engineering, computational science, and much more. During the day we started with an Inspiring Science Talk from Pete Lomas, the inventor/creator of the Raspberry Pi computer.



Secondly, we were invited to explore the science fair which had a wide variety of hands-on demonstrations for the students to interact with. Including robot dogs, drones, liquid-nitrogen ice cream, amongst many others.




After lunch we went into one of the large workshops to view a 6m diameter interactive model of the Sun. The star at the centre of our solar system, where we could learn how the Sun operates and have a look at some real meteorites which had come from some incredible locations (Mars, the Moon and destroyed planet cores!) Finally, we had a workshop learning about the James Webb Space telescope where the students were taught how telescopes work and the incredible design work required to put a telescope into orbit.

Daresbury Laboratories – Year 12

Year 12 Advanced Level Physics students visited Daresbury Laboratory to learn about Particle Accelerators and their industrial applications. Pictured below, Natalie Segamwenge (12NSt) operates a model to simulate the process of accelerating particles. Also pictured, Natalie and Willow Lewis (12SSm) experiment on real gamma ray sources to investigate the attenuation of a beam of radiation.





Physics students also had the opportunity to enter the particle accelerator to understand the stages of taking a stationary electron to almost the speed of light.



Am I eligible for Free School Meals?

- Child Tax Credit but not Working Tax Credit and have an annual income that does not exceed £16,190

- Working Tax Credit run-on paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying for Working Tax Credit
- Universal Credit if you apply on or after 1 April 2018 your household income must be less than £7,400 a year (after tax and not including any benefits you get)

Do you receive Working Tax credit?

If you or a partner receive Working Tax Credit regardless of income you will not qualify for free school meals.

Got Any ID? Free Creative Writing Workshops for Young People aged 12-18 on Identity and Individuality

My name is Charlie and I am the creative director of literary arts organisation Read Now Write Now.

Over the summer holidays we will be delivering free creative writing courses for young people aged between 12 and 18 years about identity and individuality. These courses will take place in local libraries and on Zoom and are funded by Arts Council England with support from Wirral, Halton and Cheshire West & Chester Library services.

During inclusive and positive group workshops young people will be able to express their own ideas and experiences looking at themes including diversity and what inspires and interests them.

Using writing devices and techniques plus a selection of relevant literature, they will be guided to write a short story which can be included into a published anthology and also made available online. There will also be a book launch at Storyhouse, Chester, in the autumn, where they will have the opportunity, if they wish, to read their story to an audience of young people.
