Prior Learning (Topic) CHINA vs USA		
<u>How is India an Emerging Economy</u> Students will broaden their locational knowledge of India to include where in the world it is found, what continent it is found within and neighbouring countries. Students will gain an understanding on the physical geography of India which will enable them to develop a sense of scale for the country and subsequently relate this to the human features. This includes economic development within India and increasing wealth, sources of that wealth and the positive and negative impacts it is having upon the people and the environment.		
<u>Global Issues</u> Students will explore some of the global issues facing humanity in today’s World. The topic will look at issues that arise in line with increasing consumerism e.g. plastic pollution, tourism and damage to wilderness areas; the challenges these pose and the ways in which they can be managed for a more sustainable future.
