Objective 2.

Improve the Literacy skills of Disadvantaged students in KS3 to close the gap between chronological/ actual reading age.

- Accelerated Reader
- Reading Recovery
- Staff CPD for PP costs
- Specialist Member of staff (PP TA) on GROW KS3 Training (3 full days)
- Students spending at least 2 hours per week, during school, reading texts matched to their ability. Progress is being monitored after each text and reading ages recorded and analysed on a half-termly basis.

Success Criteria:

Uhole School Literacy Initiatives leading to an improvement in Reading Ages across KS3 for all Disadvantaged students so that they are at least of chronological age
