Students will practically study the conventions of Greek Theatre. They will be introduced to its origins and key features of the style.

Greek Theatre Students will learn about history and conventions of Greek Theatre and how to use them in a performance. They will find out about the nature of comedy and tragedy in Greek myths and legends, followed by creating a contemporary interpretation of Greek Theatre using key feature of the style.			Assessment: Practical: Students will produce a devised performance that includes the conventions of Greek Theatre. <i>Practical skills are formally assessed using agreed grade descriptors adapted from 9-1 GCSE grade descriptors for Drama.</i> Drama Passports (written assessment): Students will peer-evaluate in their Drama passport. The passports will allow the students to reflect on their ability to create, perform and evaluate throughout the term.
