<p>Prior Learning (Topic) Shakespeare 'Romeo and Juliet'</p> <hr style="border-top: 1px dashed black;"/> <p><u>Exploring Non-Fiction</u> Students will be learning about different forms of non-fiction writing. All pieces covered will have a thematic link.</p> <p><u>Speech Writing</u> Students will look at the features of an effective speech and how it should be structured to engage an audience. <p><u>Exploring Non-Fiction</u> Study the conventions of non-fiction pieces in the 19th and 21st centuries. The pieces covered will have a thematic link and allow for suitable comparison. Evaluate arguments for and against.</p>	<p><i>Each term will involve at least one extended piece of writing and a minimum of 3 other formative assessments. These may include quizzing, exit tickets, whole class feedback and live marking.</i></p> <p>Extended Piece: Evaluate argumentative non-fiction texts. Formulate and write about your opinions, using evidence from a text.</p>	
<p><u>Speech Writing</u> Students will learn about the different types of openings in effective stories and seek to deploy these in their own work. All pupils will be asked to produce a piece of creative writing, and look at improving their work through an editorial process.</p>	<p><i>Each term will involve at least one extended piece of writing and a minimum of 3 other formative assessments. These may include quizzing, exit tickets, whole class feedback and live marking.</i></p> <p>End of Year Exam Reading Exam: Reading Questions based on an extract from a fiction text.</p>

<p>Encourage students to read often and widely. Encourage and model reading for non-fiction texts. Watch key speeches from throughout history such as Martin Luther King and Barack Obama. Support students with practising their speech at home before they speak in front of peers.</p>
